



DESCRIPTION OF COURSE

Description:

An arbitration award hinges on the determination of the merits of a case by an arbitral tribunal, akin to the judgment delivered by a national court of law. However, arbitration awards and judgments are different in many ways. This course focuses on the elements of international arbitration awards, their form and content, and effects. It also discusses in which circumstances an award can be challenged, appealed, and/or denied enforcement. Attention is given to the relevant provisions of the Mauritius International Arbitration Act 2008 and other international arbitration legislations, and international case law. Attendees are invited to share their experience and participate in the discussions. As a take-home, attendees are expected to better understand the essentials of an international arbitration award and its limits.
