Paul is the Economic Officer at the U.S. Embassy in Port Louis. However, prior to joining the U.S. Foreign Service, he was Senior Counsel/Trial Attorney at the Environmental Enforcement Section of the United States Department of Justice (DOJ) for 17 years. Prior to that, he practiced environmental law with a private law firm in Washington DC. During his career with DOJ, Paul represented the United States Government in civil litigation under a variety of federal environmental statutes, primarily cases involving pollution, hazardous waste cleanup and natural resource damages. He was first chair/ lead counsel in multiple cases, notably a significant lawsuit involving novel legal issues and resulting in a cleanup that will cost over \$200 million. Paul graduated with a specialty in environmental law from Tulane Law School in Louisiana, and has law licenses in North Carolina and Washington DC (both currently in inactive status).
