Joanna Korner was Called to the Bar in 1974, took silk in 1993 and was appointed a Circuit Judge in 2012.

Prior to her judicial role, she prosecuted and defended complex criminal cases. She was also a Senior Prosecuting Trial Attorney at the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia and was the lead prosecutor in the cases of Prosecutor v. Radoslav Brdjanin & Momir Talic, Prosecutor v. Milomir Stakic.

Joanna is a leading advocacy trainer. From 2005-2011, she was Head of International Faculty of Advocacy Training Council (now ICCA). She has organised and taught on numerous advocacy training courses in the UK and internationally. Joanna is also the lead judge on International Judicial Training for the Judicial College.
