Objectives of the IJLS Law Journal

The IJLS Law Journal aims to be a forum that involves, promotes and engages law practitioners, scholars and the judiciary to express and share their ideas and opinions on contemporary legal issues. The IJLS Journal also plans to feature guest articles by eminent legal scholars and law practitioners as well as articles by the members of the judiciary, thereby providing an interface for all stakeholders within the justice system with the objective of share knowledge and knowhow on Mauritian and international law.

Submissions Categories

1. Articles (Long articles – between 5000 – 6000 words including footnotes & Short articles – between 2000 – 3000 words including footnotes);
2. Book reviews (1000 – 2000 words including footnotes);
3. Case Commentaries (1000 – 3000 words including footnotes); or
4. Comments/Articles on Policies, Documents, Draft Bills, Law Commission Reports or Committee reports (3000 – 5000 words including footnotes).

Submission Guidelines:

1. Submissions are to be made in electronic form only, and sent to ijls@govmu.org in MS Word format – (.doc or .docx).
2. A short bio profile (of approximately 300 words) including qualifications and institutional affiliations, if any.
3. Only original work will be accepted. It is presumed that, once the work has been sent, that it is the original work of the author so named and that it has not been published anywhere else. The work will be checked for plagiarism before the editing process.
4. The author should maintain a uniform mode of citation throughout the whole work. The font to be used should be as per OSCOLA (<https://www.law.ox.ac.uk/research-subject-groups/publications/oscola>).

Scope and Relevance

The work must be on contemporary legal issues in Mauritian and/or international law. The language used must be formal, simply and clear, adhering to the submissions guidelines of the journal.

Submission Areas

Jurisprudence, law of obligations, business law, international law, maritime and shipping law, family law, constitutional and administrative law, law of arbitration, criminal law, intellectual property law, international human rights law, and competition law.

Review Process

The submissions received would be reviewed and the editor(s) would determine whether the subject matter fits within the scope of the IJLS Law Journal and also would assess the quality of the manuscript. The decision on publication will be solely at the discretion of the Chief Editor and it takes a minimum of one month after the deadline for the publication.

Submission Deadline

All articles should be submitted at noon by 6 September 2019.
